CROSS TIMBERS CATECHISM

This Week: WHAT DOES THE BIBLE TEACH WAS THE REASON JESUS DIED ON THE CROSS?

Answer: Jesus suffered and died on the cross that mankind may have their sins forgiven and be cleansed (1 Peter 1:18–19). In his death Jesus took our place under the wrath of God. He was punished for our sins in our place (Isaiah 53:5–6).

Next Week: WHAT HAPPENED AFTER JESUS DIED AND WAS BURIED?

Answer: On the third day Jesus rose from the grave, never to die again (Luke 24:1–8). This rising is called the resurrection.
